He is a founding member of the **Society for Ecological Restoration** and the founding editor of **Management and Restoration Notes** (now **Ecological Restoration**), the first publication on ecological restoration. He is the author of **The Sunflower Forest: Ecological Restoration and the New Communion with Nature**, published by University of California Press in 2003. The book is based in part on a year of research in the **Department of Philosophy and Religion Studies** at UNT, funded by the **National Science Foundation**.
